CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BEDFORD TAX EXEMPTION ORDINANCE AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NUMBER 3/12/15/18

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR A SERVICE CHARGE IN LIEU OF TAXES FOR A PROPOSED MULTIPLE FAMILY DWELLING PROJECT FOR PERSONS OF LOW INCOME TO BE FINANCED BY OR ASSISTED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE STATE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ACT OF 1966, AS AMENDED.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BEDFORD ORDAINS:

Ordinance Number 3/12/15/18 is hereby amended by striking SECTION 9. DURATION in its entirety and substituting therefor the following:

SECTION 9. DURATION

This ordinance shall remain in effect and shall not terminate so long as the Authority's Mortgage Loan remains outstanding and unpaid or the Authority has any interest in the property; or the Housing Development remains subject to income and rent restrictions pursuant to Section 42 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, provided that construction of the Housing Development commence within two years from the effective date of this ordinance.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been passed and adopted by the Charter Township of Bedford, County of Calhoun, State of Michigan, at a regularly scheduled meeting thereof duly called and held this September 14, 2017.
